

ARISING TO ACTION CUPE 3911 Indigenous Undergraduate Student <u>Award</u> 2025 Nomination Form

In December 2021, the CUPE Local 3911 at Athabasca University established a new award called the Arising to Action Undergraduate Student Award.

Two (2) awards in the amount of \$1,000 will be offered annually to Indigenous undergraduate students at Athabasca University. The intent of the award is to support Indigenous learners' educational access, achievement, and success at Athabasca University, by financially supporting their higher education and to support their ability to give back to Indigenous community.

Eligibility:

Open to Indigenous (Status Indian/First Nations, Non-Status Indian/First Nations, Métis and Inuit) AU students in any degree program, in any year of study. Nominees can be part-time or full-time AU students. First-time nominees will be given priority.

Nominations:

There are two options for nominations:

- 1. Students may nominate themselves.
- 2. AU staff members or students may nominate a student for the award. There must be no conflict of interest in the relationship between the nominator to the nominee (i.e. family relationship).

Application procedure:

- 1. Fill in the requested details in the nomination form (below).
- 2. If you are nominating someone else, include a signed copy of the form Consent to Disclosure of Personal Information (below).
- 3. Applicants should provide proof of their Indigenous ancestry and/or a statement describing their connection to their community. Some forms of proof may include one (1) of the following:
 - certificate of Indian Status, a status card or a valid band membership card
 - letter from band verifying status

- membership card issues by a Métis government the student is registered with (Métis government or organization must be a legal entity)
- certified copy of a Nunavut Trust Certificate card or Inuit beneficiary card
- letter of support from Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada or Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated
- letter of support from a First Nation, Métis or Inuit organization (must be a legal entity) confirming the applicant's Indigenous ancestry
- Statement of connection to Indigenous community
